Holkham boasts windswept tidelines, a maze of creeks and saltings, miles of dunes and sandspits, shady pinewoods, green pastures and marshes.

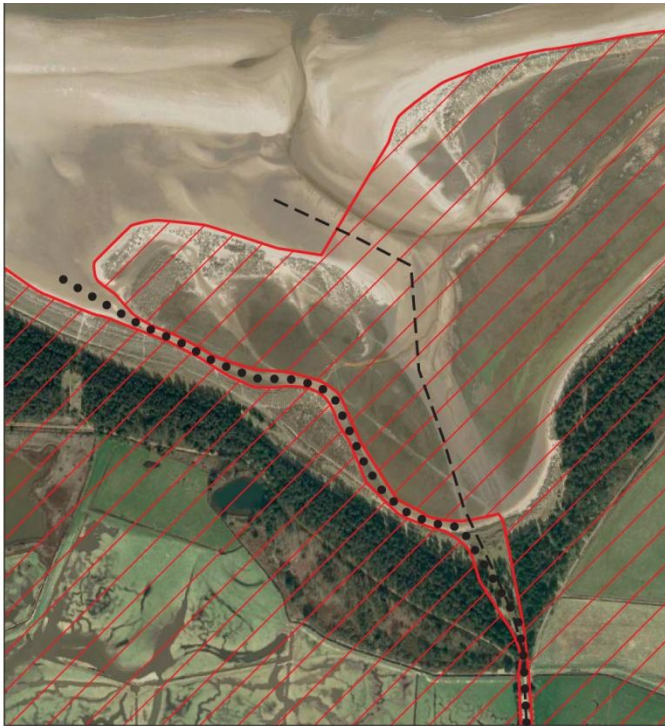
The mix of habitats and the blend of wildlife make Holkham's National Nature Reserve a truly unique place.




Riding horses on the beach is a thrilling experience and a great privilege, but please be aware of the long-lasting damage that could easily be caused to the fragile vegetation.

If you are enjoying a ride here, please help us preserve this area of beauty and the natural wildlife by following the conditions overleaf.

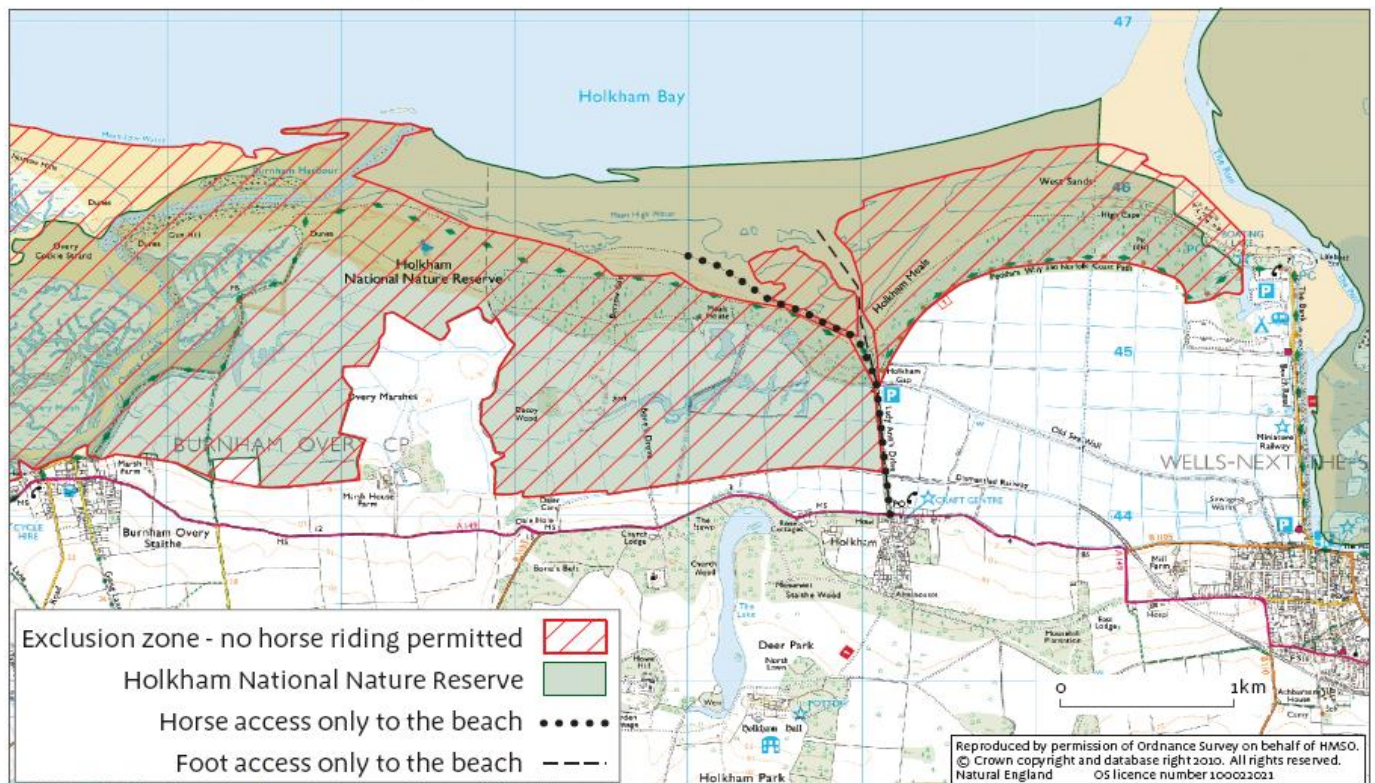




Please help us to protect this internationally important nature reserve by observing the following restrictions:-



Exclusion zone - no horse riding permitted   
 Horse access only to the beach   
 Foot access only to the beach 

- Riding is only permitted on the sandy beach, below the high water mark.
- No riding permitted on the sand dunes, shingle ridges, saltmarsh or within the woodlands.
- Horses should access the beach by the track avoiding marsh vegetation.
- No riding is permitted on the main pedestrian route to the shore.
- There is strictly no access for horses across the Burnham Overy Channel to Scolt Head Island.
